



# PARENTS SIGN LEASE SCHEME AND IPADS ARE 'SET UP' USING WHS SYSTEMS






## ROLL-OUT

- Key Stage 3 initially (Years 8-10)
- Then rolled out yearly
- Current uptake: 99% of student body
- Leasing scheme through Academia
- Individual devices also allowed

- Leasing scheme


- Classroom management
